Poverty measurement dimensions


Social Right's approach

- Lack of access to health services
- Lack of access to social security
- Lack of access to basic housing services

 - Lack of food security


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Clear public policy

In 2012, the government decided to use the multidimensional poverty indicator as a main guide for social policy




Mexican Multidimensional Poverty Indicator

- Approved by the Mexican Congress; methodology can't be modified (2008-2018) as to guarantee long-term comparability
- A political and technical agreement (national and international experts, government, Congress, National Statistics Office)
- A tool for monitoring public policy and accountability
 - CONEVAL is an independent institution and officially in charge of measuring poverty
- Public policy links better to multidimensional poverty than to an income approach
- Each ministry is responsible for their corresponding dimension
- Local governments compete to reduce poverty
- MP can be disaggregated by groups- emphasis on children (with UNICEF)
- Links to SDG's




Number of people living in extreme poverty 2008-2016






Percentage of the population living in extreme poverty

2008-2016






Number of people living in poverty 2008-2016






Percentage of the population living in poverty 2008-2016
